## Double-flowered Variegated Crepe Jasmine



### Double-flowered Variegated Crepe Jasmine *Tabernaemontana divaricata 'Plena Variegata'*

Height: 6 feet

Spread: 8 feet

Sunlight:

Other Names: East India Rosebay, Nero's Crown

#### Description:

This shrub is very attractive, and features large, variegated green and yellow leaves; showy, fully double white flowers appear year-round, but primarily in spring; fruit appears in pairs and ripens bright red; can be grown indoors in colder climates

#### Ornamental Features

Double-flowered Variegated Crepe Jasmine features showy clusters of fragrant white round flowers with gold eyes at the ends of the branches from early to late spring, which emerge from distinctive buttery yellow flower buds. It has attractive buttery yellow-variegated dark green foliage with hints of grayish green which emerges chartreuse in spring. The large glossy narrow leaves are highly ornamental and remain dark green throughout the winter. It produces orange capsules from mid summer to late fall, which fade to red over time. The rough gray bark is extremely showy and adds significant winter interest.

#### Landscape Attributes

Double-flowered Variegated Crepe Jasmine is a dense multi-stemmed evergreen shrub with an upright spreading habit of growth. Its relatively coarse texture can be used to stand it apart from other landscape plants with finer foliage.

This is a relatively low maintenance shrub, and should only be pruned after flowering to avoid removing any of the current season's flowers. It is a good choice for attracting butterflies to your yard. It has no significant negative characteristics.

Double-flowered Variegated Crepe Jasmine is recommended for the following landscape applications;

- Accent
- Mass Planting
- Hedges/Screening
- Container Planting

## Double-flowered Variegated Crepe Jasmine

### Planting & Growing

Double-flowered Variegated Crepe Jasmine will grow to be about 6 feet tall at maturity, with a spread of 8 feet. It has a low canopy with a typical clearance of 1 foot from the ground, and is suitable for planting under power lines. It grows at a medium rate, and under ideal conditions can be expected to live for 60 years or more.

This shrub does best in full sun to partial shade. It does best in average to evenly moist conditions, but will not tolerate standing water. This plant should be periodically fertilized throughout the active growing season with a specially-formulated acidic fertilizer. It is very fussy about its soil conditions and must have rich, acidic soils to ensure success, and is subject to chlorosis (yellowing) of the foliage in alkaline soils. It is somewhat tolerant of urban pollution. Consider applying a thick mulch around the root zone in winter to protect it in exposed locations or colder microclimates. This is a selected variety of a species not originally from North America, and parts of it are known to be toxic to humans and animals, so care should be exercised in planting it around children and pets.

Double-flowered Variegated Crepe Jasmine makes a fine choice for the outdoor landscape, but it is also well-suited for use in outdoor pots and containers. With its upright habit of growth, it is best suited for use as a 'thriller' in the 'spiller-thriller-filler' container combination; plant it near the center of the pot, surrounded by smaller plants and those that spill over the edges. It is even sizeable enough that it can be grown alone in a suitable container. Note that when grown in a container, it may not perform exactly as indicated on the tag - this is to be expected. Also note that when growing plants in outdoor containers and baskets, they may require more frequent waterings than they would in the yard or garden. Be aware that in our climate, most plants cannot be expected to survive the winter if left in containers outdoors, and this plant is no exception.
