



### **Patio Pride Snap Pea** *Pisum sativum 'Patio Pride'*

#### **Description:**

Early maturing with high yields, this compact bushy variety is perfect for patio containers; children have a great time growing and picking these delicious, 3" long green snap peas; sweet and succulent, terrific fresh or cooked; succession planting

#### **Edible Qualities**

Patio Pride Snap Pea is an annual vegetable plant that is commonly grown for its edible qualities. It produces pods of green pods which are typically harvested when mature. The pods have a sweet taste and a crisp texture.

The pods are most often used in the following ways:

- Fresh Eating
- Eating When Cooked/Prepared
- Cooking
- Baking
- Freezing

#### **Planting & Growing**

Patio Pride Snap Pea will grow to be about 18 inches tall at maturity, with a spread of 12 inches. When planted in rows, individual plants should be spaced approximately 10 inches apart. This fast-growing vegetable plant is an annual, which means that it will grow for one season in your garden and then die after producing a crop.

This plant is typically grown in a designated vegetable garden. It does best in full sun to partial shade. It does best in average to evenly moist conditions, but will not tolerate standing water. This plant is capable of fixing its own nitrogen, which means that it is effectively self-fertilizing. As a result it should not require supplemental fertilizing, and if you do fertilize it, be sure to only use a low-nitrogen fertilizer to promote root growth. It is not particular as to soil pH, but grows best in rich soils. It is somewhat tolerant of urban pollution. Consider applying a thick mulch around the root zone over the growing season to conserve soil moisture. This is a selected variety of a species not originally from North America.

Patio Pride Snap Pea is a good choice for the vegetable garden, but it is also well-suited for use in outdoor pots and containers. It is often used as a 'filler' in the 'spiller-thriller-filler' container combination, providing the canvas against which the larger thriller plants stand out. Note that when growing plants in outdoor containers and baskets, they may require more frequent waterings than they would in the yard or garden.
