



**Tianis Rose with Eye Picotee Cyclamen**  
*Cyclamen 'Tianis Rose with Eye Picotee'*

**Description:**

Elegant, nodding light rose flowers with dark red eyes rise above interesting green and silver foliage in summer; very round and sturdy habit; excellent for containers and rock gardens; a lovely indoor accent plant

**Features & Attributes**

Tianis Rose with Eye Picotee Cyclamen features showy lightly-scented nodding rose recurved flowers with shell pink overtones and dark red eyes rising above the foliage in mid summer. Its attractive heart-shaped leaves remain bluish-green in color with showy silver variegation throughout the year.

This is an herbaceous evergreen houseplant with tall flower stalks held atop a low mound of foliage. This plant should not require much pruning, except when necessary to keep it looking its best.

**Planting & Growing**

When grown indoors, Tianis Rose with Eye Picotee Cyclamen can be expected to grow to be about 8 inches tall at maturity extending to 14 inches tall with the flowers, with a spread of 10 inches. It grows at a medium rate, and under ideal conditions can be expected to live for approximately 10 years. This houseplant should be situated in a location that gets indirect sunlight at most, although it will usually require a more brightly-lit environment than what artificial indoor lighting alone can provide. It does best in average to evenly moist soil, but will not tolerate standing water. The surface of the soil shouldn't be allowed to dry out completely, and so you should expect to water this plant once and possibly even twice each week. Be aware that your particular watering schedule may vary depending on its location in the room, the pot size, plant size and other conditions; if in doubt, ask one of our experts in the store for advice. It is not particular as to soil type or pH; an average potting soil should work just fine.
