Jennifer Rebecca Tropical Water Lily *Nymphaea 'Jennifer Rebecca'*

Description:

A night blooming variety with spectacular red to hot pink star-shaped flowers with black centers, over deep red pads that eventually mature to green with red spots; tolerates heat well; water lilies dislike moving water; annual in colder climates

Ornamental Features

Jennifer Rebecca Tropical Water Lily features showy cherry red star-shaped flowers with hot pink overtones and black eyes at the ends of the stems from early summer to late fall. The flowers are excellent for cutting. Its attractive glossy round leaves emerge brick red in spring, turning green in colour with distinctive dark red spots the rest of the year.

Landscape Attributes

Jennifer Rebecca Tropical Water Lily is an herbaceous annual with a ground-hugging habit of growth. Its relatively coarse texture can be used to stand it apart from other garden plants with finer foliage.

This plant will require occasional maintenance and upkeep, and should be cut back in late fall in preparation for winter. It has no significant negative characteristics.

Planting & Growing

Jennifer Rebecca Tropical Water Lily will grow to be about 14 inches tall at maturity, with a spread of 6 feet. Its foliage tends to remain dense right to the ground, not requiring facer plants in front. Although it's not a true annual, this fast-growing plant can be expected to behave as an annual in our climate if left outdoors over the winter, usually needing replacement the following year. As such, gardeners should take into consideration that it will perform differently than it would in its native habitat.

This plant should only be grown in full sunlight. It is an excellent choice for very wet locations or locations with some standing water. To help this plant achieve its best flowering performance, periodically apply a flower-boosting fertilizer from early spring through into the active growing season. It is not particular as to soil type or pH. It is somewhat tolerant of urban pollution. This particular variety is an interspecific hybrid. It can be propagated by division; however, as a cultivated variety, be aware that it may be subject to certain restrictions or prohibitions on propagation.

Jennifer Rebecca Tropical Water Lily is a fine choice for the garden, but it is also a good selection for planting in outdoor pots and containers. Because of its spreading habit of growth, it is ideally suited for use as a 'spiller' in the 'spiller-thriller-filler' container combination; plant it near the edges where it can spill gracefully over the pot. Note that when growing plants in outdoor containers and baskets, they may require more frequent waterings than they would in the yard or garden.
