Description:

This interesting variety has eye-catching twisted leaves that are medium to dark green with creamy-yellow edges; lavender-purple flowers in mid to late summer; a moderately vigorous grower with an unusual texture; quite hardy and low maintenance

Ornamental Features

Bachelor Party Hosta features dainty spikes of lavender tubular flowers rising above the foliage from mid to late summer. Its attractive twisted leaves remain green in colour with distinctive buttery yellow edges throughout the season. The burgundy stems can be quite attractive.

Landscape Attributes

Bachelor Party Hosta is an herbaceous perennial with tall flower stalks held atop a low mound of foliage. Its relatively fine texture sets it apart from other garden plants with less refined foliage.

This is a relatively low maintenance plant, and is best cleaned up in early spring before it resumes active growth for the season. Gardeners should be aware of the following characteristic(s) that may warrant special consideration;

- Insects

Planting & Growing

Bachelor Party Hosta will grow to be about 14 inches tall at maturity extending to 24 inches tall with the flowers, with a spread of 30 inches. When grown in masses or used as a bedding plant, individual plants should be spaced approximately 24 inches apart. Its foliage tends to remain dense right to the ground, not requiring facer plants in front. It grows at a fast rate, and under ideal conditions can be expected to live for approximately 10 years. As an herbaceous perennial, this plant will usually die back to the crown each winter, and will regrow from the base each spring. Be careful not to disturb the crown in late winter when it may not be readily seen!

This plant does best in partial shade to shade. It prefers to grow in average to moist conditions, and shouldn't be allowed to dry out. This plant does not require much in the way of fertilizing once established. It is not particular as to soil type or pH. It is somewhat tolerant of urban pollution. This particular variety is an interspecific hybrid. It can be propagated by division; however, as a cultivated variety, be aware that it may be subject to certain restrictions or prohibitions on propagation.
