Description:

This interesting variety presents flat, lance-shaped, deep green foliage, providing beautiful texture and contrast to other plants; lavender-purple flowers on dark red-purple scapes in mid to late summer; great for borders, beds and containers

Ornamental Features

Raspberry Sorbet Hosta features dainty spikes of purple tubular flowers rising above the foliage from mid to late summer. Its attractive textured narrow leaves remain dark green in colour throughout the season.

Landscape Attributes

Raspberry Sorbet Hosta is a dense herbaceous perennial with tall flower stalks held atop a low mound of foliage. Its relatively coarse texture can be used to stand it apart from other garden plants with finer foliage.

This is a relatively low maintenance plant, and is best cleaned up in early spring before it resumes active growth for the season. Gardeners should be aware of the following characteristic(s) that may warrant special consideration;

- Insects

Planting & Growing

Raspberry Sorbet Hosta will grow to be only 6 inches tall at maturity extending to 12 inches tall with the flowers, with a spread of 30 inches. When grown in masses or used as a bedding plant, individual plants should be spaced approximately 18 inches apart. Its foliage tends to remain low and dense right to the ground. It grows at a slow rate, and under ideal conditions can be expected to live for approximately 10 years. As an herbaceous perennial, this plant will usually die back to the crown each winter, and will regrow from the base each spring. Be careful not to disturb the crown in late winter when it may not be readily seen!

This plant does best in partial shade to shade. It prefers to grow in average to moist conditions, and shouldn't be allowed to dry out. This plant does not require much in the way of fertilizing once established. It is not particular as to soil type or pH. It is somewhat tolerant of urban pollution. This particular variety is an interspecific hybrid. It can be propagated by division; however, as a cultivated variety, be aware that it may be subject to certain restrictions or prohibitions on propagation.
