### Description:

A late ripening selection featuring showy pink flowers in spring, followed by large, freestone peaches with excellent flavor and color for a late peach; very sweet and firm, perfect for baking, preserves, freezing and canning

### Edible Qualities

Flamin' Fury PF Big George Peach is a small tree that is commonly grown for its edible qualities. It produces large yellow round fruit (technically 'drupes') with a dark red blush and gold flesh which are typically harvested when mature. Note that the fruits have hard inedible pits inside which must be removed before eating or processing. The fruits have a sweet taste and a juicy texture.

The fruit are most often used in the following ways:

- Fresh Eating
- Cooking
- Baking
- Preserves
- Canning

### Features & Attributes

Flamin' Fury PF Big George Peach is smothered in stunning clusters of fragrant shell pink flowers along the branches from early to mid spring, which emerge from distinctive rose flower buds before the leaves. It has dark green deciduous foliage. The narrow leaves turn yellow in fall. The fruits are showy yellow drupes with a dark red blush, which are carried in abundance from mid to late summer.

## Flamin' Fury PF Big George Peach

---

This is a deciduous tree with a more or less rounded form. Its average texture blends into the landscape, but can be balanced by one or two finer or coarser trees or shrubs for an effective composition. This plant will require occasional maintenance and upkeep, and should only be pruned in summer after the leaves have fully developed, as it may 'bleed' sap if pruned in late winter or early spring. It is a good choice for attracting bees, butterflies and squirrels to your yard. Gardeners should be aware of the following characteristic(s) that may warrant special consideration;

- Insects
- Disease

Aside from its primary use as an edible, Flamin' Fury PF Big George Peach is suitable for the following landscape applications;

- Accent
- General Garden Use
- Orchard/Edible Landscaping

### Planting & Growing

Flamin' Fury PF Big George Peach will grow to be about 18 feet tall at maturity, with a spread of 18 feet. It has a low canopy with a typical clearance of 2 feet from the ground, and is suitable for planting under power lines. It grows at a medium rate, and under ideal conditions can be expected to live for approximately 30 years. While it is considered to be somewhat self-pollinating, it tends to set heavier quantities of fruit with a different variety of the same species growing nearby.

This tree is typically grown in a designated area of the yard because of its mature size and spread. It does best in full sun to partial shade. It does best in average to evenly moist conditions, but will not tolerate standing water. It is not particular as to soil type or pH. It is somewhat tolerant of urban pollution. This is a selected variety of a species not originally from North America.
