



### Hot Spot Foamy Bells

*Heucherella 'Hot Spot'*

Plant Height: 8 inches

#### Description:

A striking variety with bright lime-green leaves with contrasting dark red spots radiating from the leaf centers; dainty pink bell flowers in late spring and through summer; a vigorous grower that forms a dense mound

#### Ornamental Features

Hot Spot Foamy Bells features dainty spikes of pink bell-shaped flowers with white overtones rising above the foliage from late spring to late summer. The flowers are excellent for cutting. Its attractive glossy lobed leaves remain lime green in color with distinctive dark red spots and tinges of buttery yellow throughout the year.

#### Landscape Attributes

Hot Spot Foamy Bells is a dense herbaceous evergreen perennial with tall flower stalks held atop a low mound of foliage. Its medium texture blends into the garden, but can always be balanced by a couple of finer or coarser plants for an effective composition.

This is a relatively low maintenance plant, and should be cut back in late fall in preparation for winter. It is a good choice for attracting hummingbirds to your yard. It has no significant negative characteristics.

### **Planting & Growing**

Hot Spot Foamy Bells will grow to be about 8 inches tall at maturity extending to 14 inches tall with the flowers, with a spread of 24 inches. When grown in masses or used as a bedding plant, individual plants should be spaced approximately 20 inches apart. Its foliage tends to remain low and dense right to the ground. It grows at a medium rate, and under ideal conditions can be expected to live for approximately 10 years. As an evergreen perennial, this plant will typically keep its form and foliage year-round.

This plant does best in partial shade to shade. It prefers to grow in average to moist conditions, and shouldn't be allowed to dry out. It is not particular as to soil type or pH. It is somewhat tolerant of urban pollution. Consider covering it with a thick layer of mulch in winter to protect it in exposed locations or colder microclimates. This particular variety is an interspecific hybrid. It can be propagated by division; however, as a cultivated variety, be aware that it may be subject to certain restrictions or prohibitions on propagation.

Hot Spot Foamy Bells is a fine choice for the garden, but it is also a good selection for planting in outdoor pots and containers. It is often used as a 'filler' in the 'spiller-thriller-filler' container combination, providing a mass of flowers and foliage against which the larger thriller plants stand out. Note that when growing plants in outdoor containers and baskets, they may require more frequent waterings than they would in the yard or garden.
