



## Grand Duke Gardenia

*Gardenia jasminoides* 'Grand Duke'

Height: 4 feet

### Description:

The creamy white, fully double blooms of this variety are more akin to that of a small peony bloom, contrasting the large deep green foliage; great as an indoor container plant

### Features & Attributes

Grand Duke Gardenia features showy fragrant white ball-shaped flowers at the ends of the branches from late spring to early summer. The flowers are excellent for cutting. Its glossy oval leaves remain dark green in color throughout the year.

This is a dense multi-stemmed evergreen houseplant with an upright spreading habit of growth. This plant may benefit from an occasional pruning to look its best.

### Planting & Growing

When grown indoors, Grand Duke Gardenia can be expected to grow to be about 4 feet tall at maturity, with a spread of 4 feet. It grows at a slow rate, and under ideal conditions can be expected to live for approximately 30 years. This houseplant will do well in a location that gets either direct or indirect sunlight, although it will usually require a more brightly-lit environment than what artificial indoor lighting alone can provide. It does best in average to evenly moist soil, but will not tolerate standing water. The surface of the soil shouldn't be allowed to dry out completely, and so you should expect to water this plant once and possibly even twice each week. Be aware that your particular watering schedule may vary depending on its location in the room, the pot size, plant size and other conditions; if in doubt, ask one of our experts in the store for advice. It is not particular as to soil pH, but grows best in rich soil. Contact the store for specific recommendations on pre-mixed potting soil for this plant.
