



Robert Lavalois Variegated Croton

Codiaeum variegatum 'Robert Lavalois'

Description:

This vigorous variety is considered a houseplant in colder climates; large, dark green pointed foliage is dramatically striped and splashed in bright yellow; a stunning accent plant for bright indoor areas

Features & Attributes

Robert Lavalois Variegated Croton's attractive large glossy pointy leaves emerge light green, turning dark green in color with showy yellow variegation and tinges of gold throughout the year on a plant with an upright spreading habit of growth. It features dainty racemes of white star-shaped flowers from late winter to early spring.

This is a dense herbaceous evergreen houseplant with an upright spreading habit of growth. Its relatively coarse texture stands it apart from other indoor plants with finer foliage. This plant should not require much pruning, except when necessary to keep it looking its best.

Planting & Growing

When grown indoors, Robert Lavalois Variegated Croton can be expected to grow to be about 5 feet tall at maturity, with a spread of 3 feet. It grows at a fast rate, and under ideal conditions can be expected to live for approximately 10 years. This houseplant will do well in a location that gets either direct or indirect sunlight, although it will usually require a more brightly-lit environment than what artificial indoor lighting alone can provide. It does best in average to evenly moist soil, but will not tolerate standing water. The surface of the soil shouldn't be allowed to dry out completely, and so you should expect to water this plant once and possibly even twice each week. Be aware that your particular watering schedule may vary depending on its location in the room, the pot size, plant size and other conditions; if in doubt, ask one of our experts in the store for advice. It will benefit from a regular feeding with a general-purpose fertilizer with every second or third watering. It is not particular as to soil pH, but grows best in rich soil. Contact the store for specific recommendations on pre-mixed potting soil for this plant. Be warned that parts of this plant are known to be toxic to humans and animals, so special care should be exercised if growing it around children and pets.
