



Rosemary Grevillea

Description:

A hardy and adaptable variety with a dense rounded form and rosemary-like foliage; grows well in most well drained soils; it will also tolerate moderate to heavy frost; pink and white spidery flower clusters mostly in winter and spring

Features & Attributes

Rosemary Grevillea features delicate pink spider-like flowers with white overtones along the branches from late winter to early summer. Its attractive tomentose narrow leaves remain dark green in color throughout the year.

This is a dense multi-stemmed evergreen houseplant with a more or less rounded form. This plant may benefit from an occasional pruning to look its best.

Planting & Growing

When grown indoors, Rosemary Grevillea can be expected to grow to be about 6 feet tall at maturity, with a spread of 6 feet. It grows at a slow rate, and under ideal conditions can be expected to live for approximately 20 years. This houseplant requires direct sun for optimal performance, and should therefore be situated in a room that gets bright sunlight for a good part of the day; it is not a good choice for rooms lit only by artificial light. It does best in average to evenly moist soil, but will not tolerate standing water. The surface of the soil shouldn't be allowed to dry out completely, and so you should expect to water this plant once and possibly even twice each week. Be aware that your particular watering schedule may vary depending on its location in the room, the pot size, plant size and other conditions; if in doubt, ask one of our experts in the store for advice. It is not particular as to soil type or pH; an average potting soil should work just fine.
