



Sultry Kiss Hibiscus

Hibiscus 'Sultry Kiss'

Description:

This bold garden perennial features showy ruffled, large hot pink flowers that are produced at the nodes all up the stems; attractive, glossy, dark-green/bronze leaves; a lovely indoor container plant; do not allow to dry to wilting point

Features & Attributes

Sultry Kiss Hibiscus features bold hot pink round flowers with red eyes along the stems from mid summer to early fall. Its pointy leaves emerge coppery-bronze, turning dark green in color throughout the year.

This is an herbaceous houseplant with an upright spreading habit of growth. Its relatively coarse texture stands it apart from other indoor plants with finer foliage. This plant may benefit from an occasional pruning to look its best.

Planting & Growing

When grown indoors, Sultry Kiss Hibiscus can be expected to grow to be about 5 feet tall at maturity, with a spread of 4 feet. It grows at a fast rate, and under ideal conditions can be expected to live for approximately 5 years. This houseplant will do well in a location that gets either direct or indirect sunlight, although it will usually require a more brightly-lit environment than what artificial indoor lighting alone can provide. It requires an evenly moist well-drained soil for optimal growth, but will suffer if left to grow in standing water. The surface of the soil shouldn't be allowed to dry out completely, and so you should expect to water this plant once and possibly even twice each week. Be aware that your particular watering schedule may vary depending on its location in the room, the pot size, plant size and other conditions; if in doubt, ask one of our experts in the store for advice. It is not particular as to soil type or pH; an average potting soil should work just fine.
