Description:

Beautiful, nodding flowers in shades of scarlet and salmon rise above foliage with wide silver margins in summer; very round and sturdy habit; excellent for containers and rock gardens; a lovely indoor accent plant

Features & Attributes

Metis Scarlet Salmon Silverleaf Cyclamen features showy lightly-scented nodding scarlet recurved flowers with salmon overtones rising above the foliage in mid summer. Its attractive heart-shaped leaves remain bluish-green in color with distinctive silver edges throughout the year.

This is an herbaceous evergreen houseplant with tall flower stalks held atop a low mound of foliage. This plant should not require much pruning, except when necessary to keep it looking its best.

Planting & Growing

When grown indoors, Metis Scarlet Salmon Silverleaf Cyclamen can be expected to grow to be only 6 inches tall at maturity extending to 12 inches tall with the flowers, with a spread of 8 inches. It grows at a medium rate, and under ideal conditions can be expected to live for approximately 10 years. This houseplant should be situated in a location that that gets indirect sunlight at most, although it will usually require a more brightly-lit environment than what artificial indoor lighting alone can provide. It does best in average to evenly moist soil, but will not tolerate standing water. The surface of the soil shouldn't be allowed to dry out completely, and so you should expect to water this plant once and possibly even twice each week. Be aware that your particular watering schedule may vary depending on its location in the room, the pot size, plant size and other conditions; if in doubt, ask one of our experts in the store for advice. It is not particular as to soil type or pH; an average potting soil should work just fine.





There are many factors that will affect the ultimate height, spread and overall performance of a plant when grown indoors; among them, the size of the pot it's growing in, the amount of light it receives, watering frequency, the pruning regimen and repotting schedule. Use the information described here as a guideline only; individual performance can and will vary.
