Edible Qualities

Stripetti Squash is an annual vegetable plant that is commonly grown for its edible qualities. It produces creamy white long fruit with dark green stripes and gold flesh which are typically harvested when mature. The fruit will often fade to orange over time. The fruits have a pleasant taste.

The fruit are most often used in the following ways:

- Cooking
- Baking

Planting & Growing

Stripetti Squash will grow to be about 24 inches tall at maturity, with a spread of 7 feet. When planted in rows, individual plants should be spaced approximately 3 feet apart. This vegetable plant is an annual, which means that it will grow for one season in your garden and then die after producing a crop.

This plant is typically grown in a designated vegetable garden. It should only be grown in full sunlight. It does best in average to evenly moist conditions, but will not tolerate standing water. It may require supplemental watering during periods of drought or extended heat. It is not particular as to soil type or pH. It is somewhat tolerant of urban pollution. Consider applying a thick mulch around the root zone over the growing season to conserve soil moisture. This is a selected variety of a species not originally from North America.
