



Raydiance Peperomia
Peperomia angulata 'Raydiance'

Description:

A beautiful plant grown primarily for its attractive, shiny deep green foliage with chartreuse veining cascading from red stems; prefers bright shade, avoid direct afternoon sun; trailing habit is great for indoor accent plants and hanging baskets

Features & Attributes

Raydiance Peperomia's attractive glossy pointy leaves emerge light green, turning dark green in color with distinctive chartreuse veins throughout the year on a plant with a trailing habit of growth. The antique red stems can be quite attractive and add to the plant's interest.

This is an herbaceous evergreen houseplant with a trailing habit of growth, eventually spilling over the edges of hanging baskets and containers. This plant should not require much pruning, except when necessary to keep it looking its best.

Planting & Growing

When grown indoors, Raydiance Peperomia can be expected to grow to be about 10 inches tall at maturity, with a spread of 18 inches. It grows at a medium rate, and under ideal conditions can be expected to live for approximately 5 years. This houseplant performs well in both bright or indirect sunlight and strong artificial light, and can therefore be situated in almost any well-lit room or location. It does best in average to evenly moist soil, but will not tolerate standing water. The surface of the soil shouldn't be allowed to dry out completely, and so you should expect to water this plant once and possibly even twice each week. Be aware that your particular watering schedule may vary depending on its location in the room, the pot size, plant size and other conditions; if in doubt, ask one of our experts in the store for advice. It will benefit from a regular feeding with a general-purpose fertilizer with every second or third watering. It is not particular as to soil pH, but grows best in rich soil. Contact the store for specific recommendations on pre-mixed potting soil for this plant.
