



**Philippi Dwarf Spurge Laurel**  
*Daphne laureola 'Philippi'*

Height: 12 inches

Spread: 5 feet

**Description:**

A superb dwarf variety with wonderfully fragrant yellow-green flowers held over a dense low mound of green glossy foliage in spring; needs light shade and well-drained soil; never move once established

**Ornamental Features**

Philippi Dwarf Spurge Laurel has fragrant chartreuse tubular flowers along the branches in mid spring. It has attractive dark green evergreen foliage which emerges light green in spring. The glossy narrow leaves are highly ornamental and remain dark green throughout the winter.

**Landscape Attributes**

Philippi Dwarf Spurge Laurel is a multi-stemmed evergreen shrub with a ground-hugging habit of growth. Its average texture blends into the landscape, but can be balanced by one or two finer or coarser trees or shrubs for an effective composition.

This shrub will require occasional maintenance and upkeep, and should never be pruned except to remove any dieback, as it tends not to take pruning well. Gardeners should be aware of the following characteristic(s) that may warrant special consideration;

- Disease

### Planting & Growing

Philippi Dwarf Spurge Laurel will grow to be about 12 inches tall at maturity, with a spread of 5 feet. It tends to fill out right to the ground and therefore doesn't necessarily require facer plants in front. It grows at a slow rate, and under ideal conditions can be expected to live for approximately 20 years.

This shrub performs well in both full sun and full shade. It prefers dry to average moisture levels with very well-drained soil, and will often die in standing water. It is not particular as to soil pH, but grows best in sandy soils. It is somewhat tolerant of urban pollution, and will benefit from being planted in a relatively sheltered location. Consider applying a thick mulch around the root zone in winter to protect it in exposed locations or colder microclimates. This is a selected variety of a species not originally from North America, and parts of it are known to be toxic to humans and animals, so care should be exercised in planting it around children and pets.

Philippi Dwarf Spurge Laurel makes a fine choice for the outdoor landscape, but it is also well-suited for use in outdoor pots and containers. Because of its spreading habit of growth, it is ideally suited for use as a 'spiller' in the 'spiller-thriller-filler' container combination; plant it near the edges where it can spill gracefully over the pot. Note that when grown in a container, it may not perform exactly as indicated on the tag - this is to be expected. Also note that when growing plants in outdoor containers and baskets, they may require more frequent waterings than they would in the yard or garden.
