#### Description:

This variety features clusters of elegant, copper-orange blooms with warm yellow centers nestled above dark green foliage for striking contrast; an illuminating display in an indoor container or basket

#### Features & Attributes

Danova Copper Primrose features delicate clusters of coppery-bronze round flowers with orange overtones and yellow eyes rising above the foliage from early spring to early fall. Its oval leaves remain dark green in color throughout the year.

This is an herbaceous evergreen houseplant with a mounded form. Its relatively fine texture sets it apart from other indoor plants with less refined foliage. This plant may benefit from an occasional pruning to look its best.

#### Planting & Growing

When grown indoors, Danova Copper Primrose can be expected to grow to be only 6 inches tall at maturity, with a spread of 7 inches. It grows at a fast rate, and under ideal conditions can be expected to live for approximately 5 years. This houseplant performs well in both bright or indirect sunlight and strong artificial light, and can therefore be situated in almost any well-lit room or location. It does best in average to evenly moist soil, but will not tolerate standing water. The surface of the soil shouldn't be allowed to dry out completely, and so you should expect to water this plant once and possibly even twice each week. Be aware that your particular watering schedule may vary depending on its location in the room, the pot size, plant size and other conditions; if in doubt, ask one of our experts in the store for advice. It is not particular as to soil type or pH; an average potting soil should work just fine.

There are many factors that will affect the ultimate height, spread and overall performance of a plant when grown indoors; among them, the size of the pot it's growing in, the amount of light it receives, watering frequency, the pruning regimen and repotting schedule. Use the information described here as a guideline only; individual performance can and will vary.
