



**White Powderpuff**  
*Calliandra haematocephala 'Alba'*

**Description:**

This is a large, multiple trunked, low branching evergreen shrub producing ferny, dark green foliage; large, white powderpuff blooms in fall and winter, with some sporadic blooming year round; an interesting accent shrub for bright indoor areas

**Features & Attributes**

White Powderpuff features showy white pincushion flowers along the branches from early fall to late winter. Its attractive oval bipinnately compound leaves remain dark green in color throughout the year.

This is a multi-stemmed evergreen houseplant with a mounded form. Its extremely fine and delicate texture is quite ornamental and should be used to full effect. This plant may benefit from an occasional pruning to look its best.

### Planting & Growing

When grown indoors, White Powderpuff can be expected to grow to be about 6 feet tall at maturity, with a spread of 3 feet. It grows at a fast rate, and under ideal conditions can be expected to live for approximately 30 years. This houseplant requires direct sun for optimal performance, and should therefore be situated in a room that gets bright sunlight for a good part of the day; it is not a good choice for rooms lit only by artificial light. It prefers to grow in average to moist soil. The surface of the soil shouldn't be allowed to dry out completely, and so you should expect to water this plant once and possibly even twice each week. Be aware that your particular watering schedule may vary depending on its location in the room, the pot size, plant size and other conditions; if in doubt, ask one of our experts in the store for advice. It is not particular as to soil type or pH; an average potting soil should work just fine.

There are many factors that will affect the ultimate height, spread and overall performance of a plant when grown indoors; among them, the size of the pot it's growing in, the amount of light it receives, watering frequency, the pruning regimen and repotting schedule. Use the information described here as a guideline only; individual performance can and will vary.
