



**Golden Plume**  
*Schaueria flavicomia*

**Description:**

A shrubby flowering perennial presenting shaggy panicles of tubular, pale yellow flowers appear year-round; attractive, narrow, glossy dark green leaves provide contrast; perfect for high to medium light indoor locations; provide humidity source

**Features & Attributes**

Golden Plume features showy panicles of yellow tubular flowers rising above the foliage from early spring to late fall. The flowers are excellent for cutting. Its large glossy narrow leaves remain forest green in color throughout the year.

This is an herbaceous evergreen houseplant with an upright spreading habit of growth. This plant may benefit from an occasional pruning to look its best.

**Planting & Growing**

When grown indoors, Golden Plume can be expected to grow to be about 3 feet tall at maturity, with a spread of 3 feet. It grows at a medium rate, and under ideal conditions can be expected to live for approximately 5 years. This houseplant will do well in a location that gets either direct or indirect sunlight, although it will usually require a more brightly-lit environment than what artificial indoor lighting alone can provide. It does best in average to evenly moist soil, but will not tolerate standing water. The surface of the soil shouldn't be allowed to dry out completely, and so you should expect to water this plant once and possibly even twice each week. Be aware that your particular watering schedule may vary depending on its location in the room, the pot size, plant size and other conditions; if in doubt, ask one of our experts in the store for advice. It will benefit from a regular feeding with a general-purpose fertilizer with every second or third watering. It is not particular as to soil pH, but grows best in rich soil. Contact the store for specific recommendations on pre-mixed potting soil for this plant.
